Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program (OYAP)

Construction Academy: This is a unique program that provides students with apprenticeship and employment opportunities in the construction industry while providing employers with a new source of workers to address skills shortages. Participating students are given the opportunity to start their apprenticeship while in high school through the Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program (OYAP) and gain real "on the job" experience. This 2-year program is available to all WECDSB students but delivered at three WECDSB schools: F. J.
